#### NOVEMBER DAYTON ART INSTITUTE EVENT

The Dayton Chapter of the AGO (DAGO) has had a musical presence at the Dayton Arts Institute for several years now. Chapter member Matt Dierking has been playing short organ "concerts" on the 1st and 3rd Sundays from 2-3pm on behalf of our group.

November 17th is your opportunity to play a piece (or two) during this informal organ concert time. The theme is "Thanksgiving" or "Harvest" and either sacred or secular music is fine.

Basically, the auditorium is open to any museum goers as they wander throughout the museum. Most don't even know the museum has an organ and curiously follow the sound of the music to the auditorium where they are surprised to find someone playing live music on the organ!

After a couple of pieces, Matt will usually talk about the organ and ask for any questions, then play several more pieces. Sometimes there are 5-6 people, sometimes more, sometimes less. They wander in and out so it's not a "formal" concert like you might expect. If you play, Matt can do the talking!

## AGO NATIONAL CHANGES THE WAY **MEMBERS JOIN**

Recently National AGO Headquarters rolled out a new way to join the AGO. This has been in the works for about a year and we hope that it will streamline the way we access the website as well as how local Chapters receive "Chapter Friend" level of membership.

As Chapter Dean, I am still trying to figure it all out, but here's what I understand so far:

The only way to join as a full member is online and any type of payment at the National Lever is online. You no longer can join National by filling out a paper form and sending them a check. It's online only.

If you are renewing your membership online, your old password does not work. You have to go through "forgot password" and resubmit your information. This is a one time thing and you can save your new password, etc. as usual. All of your autofills may not survive, so you may have refill these this first time through.

If you want to join or renew as a "Chapter Friend", which is a non-voting member that does not receive the national magazine and other benefits BUT you can be an active part of a local Chapter (100% of your dues goes to your local Chapter), you can send your dues \$50 annually) directly to the Treasurer of the Chapter. Our Treasurer is Yun Kim and she can be contacted at yunkimhughes@hotmail.com.

Again, this is all a learning curve for the National organization and the Officers and Membership Contact person at the local Chapter level. Let us know any questions and we will try and figure it out together. More information will be coming as we learn more about how to navigate this new system.
